Dear Terra,

After a busy and productive legislative session, we passed another balanced State budget – again proving that we can be both compassionate and fiscally responsible. Although I don't agree with every single line item in this 1,400-page budget, I am proud that the State of Illinois is committing resources to programs and services that expand opportunity and create a brighter future for people throughout Illinois.

The budget for the next fiscal year continues the work of rebuilding Illinois' fiscal house. Our rainy day fund has grown to more than \$1.7 billion, which will help us keep things running if revenues come up short in future years. We are also stabilizing Illinois' public pension systems by going above and beyond our required pension payment to reduce liabilities. With smart decision-making, we've paid down debt



and earned our state eight credit rating increases in less than two years.

We're continuing to support public schools by committing \$350 million in new funding for classroom education in this budget. Over the last four years, we've put more than \$1.3 billion in new funds into our public school classrooms. We're also helping to make college more affordable by making major investments in college financial aid programs, including \$100 million in new funding for the MAP grant program, for Illinois students with demonstrated financial need. We're also expanding the AIM HIGH scholarship program, which provides funds to Illinois students who attend one of our great public universities.

Our budget also gives communities some additional tools to hold the line on property taxes by committing more than \$100 million in new funding through the local government distributive fund.

We still have lots of work ahead of us, but this new budget demonstrates continuing fiscal responsibility while prioritizing investments that will build our economy and strengthen communities across our state.

It's painful to think about how many deeply creative people have been stigmatized because of their mental illnesses. So I wanted you to hear about my conversation this

week with Robert Lundin, (pictured at right), founder and President of The Awakenings Project.

Robert explained that the Awakenings Project is a grassroots initiative in the Chicago suburbs, whose mission is to foster, advance, and support the creative efforts of artists with mental illnesses and/or addictions. The Awakenings Project also works to raise public awareness, acceptance, and appreciation of art by people in recovery.

The Awakenings Project is one of just a handful of organizations that curate art shows of this kind at national or local venues. They also publish *The Awakenings Review*, to showcase the work of editors, artists, writers, and poets with mental illnesses.
