Dear Terra,

I'm very pleased that a number of bills I sponsored in the spring session successfully passed both chambers and are now headed to the Governor for his signature.

I'm proud to join my colleagues in the General Assembly in passing new laws that support public education, protect reproductive rights, prevent gun violence and expand access to healthcare, but there's always something special about seeing my own bills passed into law.

• **HB1123** – Requires school report cards for students with disabilities to include information about the student's progress toward graduation.



- HB 1555 Clarifies a guardian ad litem's responsibility to interview the child and submit written reports in family law cases involving child custody and parenting time.
- **HB 2102** Requires applicants' fingerprints to be checked against the FBI registry for a national criminal record search before they can be included in the Health Care Worker Registry.
- **HB 2861** Requires DCFS to prepare a written report within 30 days after a child is placed in a residential treatment program, and requires a court hearing to consider the report within 20 days of filing.
- **HB 3097** Improves Department of Labor's ability to enforce safety standards at amusement parks and carnivals.
- **HB 3301** Includes independent contractors in the reporting requirements of the Department of Employment Security's New Hire registry.
- SB 1804 Allows certain refrigerants to be allowed for use as long as any equipment containing the refrigerant is installed in accordance to safety standards.
- **SB 1909** Prohibits crisis pregnancy centers from using deceptive practices to interfere with anyone seeking to access emergency contraception or abortion care.
- **SB 2208** Requires public universities to grant students full credit for courses in their major subjects that those students completed at Illinois community colleges.

#### **Pride Month Spotlight: Charlene Carruthers**

For Pride Month, we're celebrating members of Illinois' LGBTQ+ community whose work is expanding our horizons and making our state even greater.

Chicago native Charlene Carruthers is the author of the bestselling book, *Unapologetic: A Black, Queer and Feminist Mandate for Radical Movements*. She is also a founding member of Black Youth Project 100, an organization that brings together students, artists, poets, service workers, media makers, and musicians to raise awareness about social justice issues. She is also a noted advocate for reproductive justice.



Carruthers, a Ph.D. candidate in Black Studies at Northwestern University, recently directed her first film, <u>The Funnel</u>, which tells the story of a young Black poet living on Chicago's South Side. The film has been showcased in multiple film festivals across the United States and in London.
